Engineer

Force Main Repair at Coe Place

Mr. McKelvey reported that the installation and welding of the new pipe sections was completed by February 16, 2013. Construction work was observed by T&M Associates' staff as well as by a representative from Hanson Pipe. A payment certificate for work completed to date, excluding a small percentage for final restoration and 2% retainage has been approved by T&M and submitted for payment. The remaining site restoration should be completed prior to the Authority's April meeting.

Solar Combiner Boxes

Mr. McKelvey reported that Vanguard continues to replace the combiner boxes as directed. Through March 12, 2013 four boxes remain to be replaced. Vanguard's surety company has requested additional information which is being compiled and will be provided to them.

Retention Pond Repairs – Super Storm Sandy

Mr. McKelvey reported that the T&M has completed draft plans and specifications for the required repairs to the retention pond and PVC liner at the Union Beach Pump Station and the required repairs to the Belford retention pond. A meeting was held between T&M and Authority staff to review the plans and specs and a draft set was provided for comments. A draft set was also sent to Witt Associates and FEMA at the Authority's request.

Super Storm Sandy Hazard Mitigation

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Mr. McKelvey reported that T&M prepared a conservative project estimate for outfall improvements to remove sand that has built up around the diffusers and to install risers on the active diffusers. The Authority prepared a Letter of Intent describing the proposed outfall mitigation and anticipated costs and submitted to the County Office of Emergency Management, who is reviewing applications for mitigation funds, during the week of February 25, 2013.

Attorney

Mr. Vella reported that a claim has been made against Vanguard Energy's maintenance bond company. Mr. Vella has been dealing with the Surety Co. and Vanguard and they would like to hire and independent consultant to do a maintenance check of the system. The testing would be split 50-50, however, whoever is liable for the repairs will then pay 100%. Mr. Vella will contact Vanguard and tell them the Authority is in agreement.

Mr. Vella and Mr. Tuberion also discussed the Energy Market Exchange with the Authority. The Energy Market Exchange is another way for the Authority to purchase Electricity from a 3rd party in order to save money. The Authority would participate in an online auction where someone would bid for our business. Currently the Authority participates in the NJSEM to purchase electricity at discounted rates. The Board agreed to authorize Mr. Tuberion to wait for the strike price from the NJSEM and then participate in the live auction with EMEX. If the auction is less than the strike price Mr. Tuberion may opt out of the NJSEM.

On **Motion** by Mr. Smith, **Seconded** by Mr. Scarano, the board authorized the Mr. Tuberion to opt out of the NJSEM and enter an agreement with EMEX if the pricing will produce a savings. This matter was passed by the affirmative voice vote of all members present, no nays, no abstain, none absent.

New Business

CONTINUING THE TEMPORARY ASSIGNMENT OF DUTIES

AND TEMPORARY STIPEND

WHEREAS, in December of 2006, Monmouth County Bayshore Outfall Authority's Executive Director resigned from her position; and

WHEREAS, by Resolution dated March 19, 2007, the Commissioners of the Monmouth County Bayshore Outfall Authority determined that in the best interest of Monmouth County Bayshore Outfall Authority, that Barbara Vilanova, Board Secretary, be assigned the financial management duties, Edward M. Tuberion,

Jr. Foreman, be assigned the operational planning of Monmouth County Bayshore Outfall Authority and Michael Sachs, Chairman, act as Comptroller; and

WHEREAS, the Commissioners of Monmouth County Bayshore Outfall Authority agreed to a stipend for these serves to be prorated an annual rate of \$10,400.00 a year for Barbara Vilanova, Board Secretary, and Edward Tuberion, Jr. Foreman. The Stipend became effective on March 1, 2008; and

WHEREAS, Michael Sachs, Chairman, waived any additional compensation for acting as Comptroller in a temporary basis; and

WHEREAS, the Commissioners have reviewed the performances of Barbara Vilanova and Edward Tuberion, Jr. and determined that their performances have been exceptional of the past 6 years and has saved the Authority the added expense of having an Executive Director; and

WHEREAS, during these 6 years the stipend has not increased and the Commissioners of Monmouth County Bayshore Outfall Authority find that an increase in the stipend is warranted and deserved; and

WHEREAS, the Commissioners of Monmouth County Bayshore Outfall Authority agreed to increase the stipend by 3 %, which increased the annual rate of \$10,712.00 a year for Barbara Vilanova, Board Secretary, and Edward Tuberion, Jr. Foreman. The Stipend shall be effective January 1, 2013; and

WHEREAS, Michael Sachs, Chairman, has waived any additional compensation for acting as Comptroller in a temporary basis; and

WHEREAS, the Monmouth County Bayshore Outfall Authority reserves the right to terminate this temporary assignment of duties and terminate the temporary stipend at any time; and

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that Monmouth County Bayshore Outfall Authority hereby agrees to increase the stipend by 3 %, which increased the annual rate of \$10,712.00 a year for Barbara Vilanova, Board Secretary, and Edward Tuberion, Jr. Foreman. The Stipend shall be effective January 1, 2013. Monmouth County Bayshore Outfall Authority hereby reserves the right to terminate the assignment of duties and stipend at any time.
