Attorney

Mr. Vella reported that on October 27th, 2011 three bids were received for the Coe Place Force Main repair. The results of the bids are as follows:

J. Fletcher Creamer \$324,280 AMC Industries \$464,559 NAVKA Construction \$507,000

All three bids came in higher than anticipated. Mr. Vella discussed the options available to the board. The bids could be rejected because they are over budget or the project could be re-bid. The latter will not guarantee any lower bids because there isn't any part of the project that could be changed. Mr. Vella has reviewed the lowest bid and determined it is a responsible bid and all of J. Fletcher Creamer's documents are in order. If the board decides to award the bid Mr. Vella will contact the NJDEP on the Authority's behalf and inform them in order to get their assistance with permits and timeframe.

Engineer

New Jersey Natural Gas Cleanup of Many Mind Creek

Mr. McKelvey reported that ERM conducted additional soils investigation in the vicinity of the MCBOA pipeline to further delineate contamination in the area of the pipe. The Authority is still awaiting the results.

Borough of Keansburg Water Treatment Plant Desalination

Mr. McKelvey reported that the Borough of Keansburg made the connection to the MCBOA pipeline on September 19, 2011. Keansburg has not yet commenced flow into the MCBOA force main.

Force Main Repair

Mr. McKelvey reported that the project was advertised for bids were received on October 27, 2011. Mr. McKelvey recommended awarding the project to the lowest bidder subject to the NJDEP's approval. Once the award is made the permit package will be sent out.

• Emergency Back-up Power Evaluation

Mr. McKelvey reported that work has begun on the Power Evaluation and a report should be ready for the December meeting.
