RESOLUTION No. 01132025-01 MONMOUTH COUNTY BAYSHORE OUTFALL AUTHORITY NJIB LOAN NO. S340325-04

WHEREAS, the Monmouth County Bayshore Outfall Authority intends to file a loan application with the New Jersey Department of Environmental Protection and the New Jersey Infrastructure Bank for the Authority's Force Main Assessment and Rehabilitation Program.

The proposed work included the assessment and rehabilitation or repair of the Authority's existing 14 mile pre-stressed concrete cylinder pipe (PCCP) force main system. Based on the results of the investigations and additional analysis conducted, several issues where identified including but not limited to (a) flow transitions to partial pipe flow in several areas throughout the force main that can cause erosion, increase corrosion and trap air downstream; (b) surge pressures were detected and at higher flow levels will impact the structural ability of the force main, causing considerable damage; and (c) lack of proper air relief function. To address these issues, the Authority proposes two (2) separate construction projects. Contract 1, Valve Replacement, will include the replacement of existing valves with new ball valves and other miscellaneous improvements at both the Belford and Union Beach Pump Stations. Contract 2, Air Relief Installation, will include the installation of two (2) new air relief systems on the existing force main discharge pipe from the Belford Pump Station, as well as other miscellaneous improvements to the existing air relief system along the force main alignment.

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, that Barbara Vilanova be authorized to act as the Authorized Representative to represent the Authority in all matters relating to the project undertaken pursuant to the above referenced New Jersey Environmental Infrastructure Loan to be executed with the New Jersey Department of Environmental Protection and the New Jersey Environmental Infrastructure Trust.
